Unleash the Power of Saving

April is National Credit Union Youth Month, and HFS is celebrating with the rest of the country to "Unleash the Power of Saving at Your Credit Union." Encouraging and cultivating good savings habits at a young age helps to lay a foundation for a healthy financial future. HFS understands this, and invites you to take advantage of the following special activities and promotions during Youth Month for keiki 17 and under:

- ✓ Open a new Kids Club account, and HFS will deposit \$20 to get you started.¹
- ✓ Existing Kids Club account holders deposit \$20 or more into your account in the month of April and HFS will deposit \$20 into your savings account.²
- ✓ Special Treat Bring your child in to make a deposit, and they will receive a complimentary treat³
- ✓ Coin Bank Contest A coin bank filled with change will be displayed at each HFS branch, island wide. Keiki who visit in-branch can submit their guess for how much money is in the coin bank. The closest guess without going over, at each branch, will win the coin bank and all the money in it!⁴
- ✓ Coloring Sheets will also be available at each branch, just for fun!

¹Annual Percentage Yield for a regular shares HFS Kids Club account is 0.15% as of March 01, 2023, and is subject to change. Fees may reduce earnings. HFS FCU will deposit \$20 to all regular share Kids Club Accounts opened from April 1, 2023 - April 29, 2023. The \$20 deposit includes the \$5 minimum balance required to open the account. The primary member on the account must be a minor, age 17 or under. The deposit is considered a bonus by the Internal Revenue Service and will be reported as taxable income (1099-INT). Limit one bonus per member. ²Eligible accounts must be opened prior to April 1, 2023 and have a minimum balance of \$5 to earn the \$20 bonus deposit. A total of \$20 must be deposited into the account's checking or savings between April 1, 2023 and April 29, 2023. If the total \$20 in deposits are met, the \$20 bonus will be deposited into the savings account no later than May 15, 2023. Primary accountholder must be a minor, age 17 or under. Not applicable for HUTMA or Representative Payee accounts. The bonus will be reported as taxable income (1099-INT). Limit one bonus per member. ³Complimentary treat available for keiki 17 and under, while supplies last. ⁴Limit 1 entry per person. Submit an entry in-branch with your keiki's name, address, and a parent/guardian phone number, along with the guess of how much money is in the coin bank. One winner will be selected for each branch, for a total of 6 winners. The keiki with the closest guess will win the coin bank, and all the coins inside. Entries accepted from April 1, 2023 - April 29, 2023. Winner will be notified no later than May 15, 2023. Fraud Prevention 101

Sometimes, that means providing you with the tools and knowledge to keep your information safe from the ever-evolving schemes that fraudsters use to trick us into giving out sensitive information. Once a fraudster steals your information they could commit identity theft. Identity theft is when someone uses your personal or financial information without your permission for the purpose of posing as you in some way for financial or other gains. Thieves may use your information to open new loans, create new accounts, make purchases, or commit other fraud.

Knowledge is a powerful tool to protect yourself from identity theft. Here are 9 ways to help prevent identity theft from happening to you.

- 1. Protect your social security number.
- 2. Use extra strong passwords and 2-step authentication when possible.
- 3. Shred sensitive documents before discarding them.
- 4. Go paperless as much as possible.
- 5. Evaluate the businesses you use to ensure they are trustworthy.
- 6. Be aware of what information you make public.
- 7. Check your home internet security.
- 8. Monitor your account activity regularly.
- 9. Set up alerts to watch for suspicious activity.

Mobile Deposit... As Easy As 1,2,3!

We love seeing you in person, but we know how busy life can be. With Mobile Deposit in the HFS App, deposit checks quickly and easily without having to come into a branch.



- 1. Log into the HFS App and select "Deposit Check".
- 2. Follow the on-screen prompts and take photos of the front, and back, of your check.
- 3. Click Submit. That's it!

*You must be enrolled in HFS FCU's Online Banking Service and Mobile Banking Service in order to use the Mobile Deposit Service. HFS FCU will charge a \$25.00 returned check fee and the amount of the check against your account if payment is not received, if payment is reversed, or if the check is dishonored or returned at any time. Standard message and data rates may apply. Check your carrier plan for details.
